Stereotyping and Bias: The Three Little Pigs and the Big ...

- For a realistic depiction of wolves, obtain the National Film Board of Canada's (wwwnfbca) film Wolf Pack, a twenty-minute documentary of the habits of wolves

Why Not "The Good, Sweet Wolf"?
