By that definition, the first neoclassical English writer was the poet, playwright and proud classicist, Ben Jonson (1572-1637). Jonson's poetry included imitations of the Roman poet Martial, and his plays were infused with the saeva indignatio (fierce anger) of the satirist Juvenal.
