Students often feel uncertain about the peer review process. Their most common fear is that they will receive “unfair” feedback from peers. To help alleviate this problem, I recommend that teachers moderate the process. Read at least some of the exchanges between students and add your own perspectives when specific student feedback is lacking.

Five Ways to Make Peer Feedback Effective In Your ...

The basic premise of peer review is to encourage further writing. The manuscript is a draft that the author seeks helpful feedback on, thus requiring a fair appraisal. Frame your criticism positively, empower the author to improve their writing and develop ideas. Give the good news along with the bad news.

Peer Review: 5 Smart Tips for Providing Constructive ...

Students submit a cover memo along with their finished product in which they explain how they revised their document in response to the reviews. Students fill out a feedback form of their own draft. Then they compare their review with the peer review and comment. Students use the feedback forms as a checklist before turning in their next drafts.

Viewing and Submitting Peer Review Assignments [Types, Guidelines] A peer review is performed to make sure that one's work is qualified with regards to the publishable standards set for writing. This peer review is often done when two or more people are asked to carefully and critically review their fellow student's paper work, and give their own constructive feedback regarding his or her writing skills.
